

FAQs *(Frequently Asked Questions)*

Who can attend? Do I need to be on NDIS?

Not at all. Our programs are open to everyone in the community, including school leavers, NDIS participants, self-funded individuals, and those supported by community or employment service providers. You can attend as many or as few as you like; each day is a new opportunity to discover, engage, and grow.

How much is it?

Path to Success is priced for the 10-week block. Discounted rates are available for organisations for multiple participants. Session prices vary depending on the pick-up locations.

How do I book or get more information?

Can I get my School or Employment Provider to contact you directly?

Absolutely, we work with many schools and a number of Workforce Australia & DES providers to deliver Path to Success right across SA, and we bill them directly. Ask us how your school may be able to work with our Employment Support team to obtain SACE points!

Do I need a support worker to attend with me?

Not necessarily. We provide mentor support during the day, but participants are welcome to bring their own support if preferred.

Is Transport Included?

Yes, we offer safe, tracked transport through our TWCI vehicle fleet that picks you up and drops you off at the conclusion of the day, depending on your location this is included in the price.
